

Your witness is vital to educating your neighbors and legislators about the dangers behind the ERA! For more information and to make your voice heard visit:



This Sunday we hear the beginning of Saint Luke's Gospel in which he makes it clear that his intention is to give us the honest truth about what Jesus said and did while visibly here on earth. The Second Vatican Council reaffirmed this belief when in Dei Verbum it stated: "Holy Mother Church has firmly and with absolute constancy held, and continues to hold, that the four Gospels just named, whose historical character the Church unhesitatingly asserts, faithfully hand on what Jesus Christ, while living among men, really did and taught for their eternal salvation until the day He was taken up into heaven." An excellent book that our book club recently went through that can help you see the truth of this belief is The Case for Jesus by Brant Pitre. As our beloved Saint Peter said, we should always be ready to make a defense of the hope that is within us.
