

Abstinence: Every person 18 years or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fasting: Every person between the age of 18 and 59 (beginning of 60th year) must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
