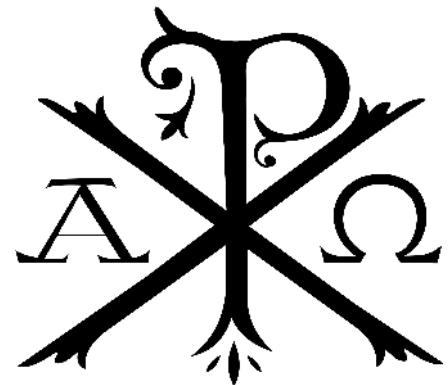

Dear Folks,

The attentive reader of the Gospel this Sunday from Saint Luke will note that the order of the temptations is different from the order given in Saint Matthew. Saint Matthew most likely recorded the literal order in which they occurred and Saint Luke changed the order so that Jerusalem was mentioned in the last temptation. Throughout his Gospel, Saint Luke highlights that our Lord's earthly life pushed Him towards Jerusalem where He would work our salvation by His passion, death, and resurrection.
