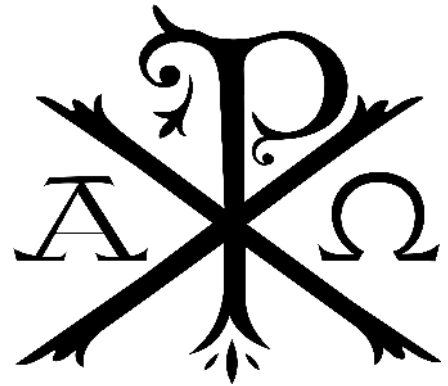

"So, the soul, according to the Divinely established order, cannot without Mary lift itself to God or do God's work." (Taken from the Legion Handbook.) Why is this? **Find out by coming to the Legion of Mary meetings on Fridays at noon in the CCD room off of the parish hall kitchen.**

-The spiritual adoption program has begun. To participate, take a prayer card from one of the baskets and say that short prayer every day (for nine months) to help save the life of an unborn baby who is in danger of being aborted.

-One Month Developing Baby: Your spiritually-adopted baby has been quite active over the past month. Already your baby is 10,000 times bigger than at conception. Your baby has developed the foundations of his/her brain, spinal cord, and nervous system by the 20th day. His/her heart began to beat on the 21st day and is pumping blood through its own circulatory system. The blood type can be different from his/her mother's. Your baby is most vulnerable during the next month of being aborted. Pray that the Lord of Life might move the heart of his/her mother to give him/her the most precious gift of all—the gift of life.

Dear Folks,

Saint Luke continues his theme of the journey to Jerusalem when in his recording of the Transfiguration, he alone of the Gospel writers includes the detail that Jesus spoke with Moses and Elijah about the exodus He was going to accomplish in Jerusalem. The exodus our Lord would work in Jerusalem was not freedom from slavery in Egypt but slavery from sin. And the food He would give us for the journey was not manna but rather His Body and Blood. Let us go with Him to Jerusalem in the spiritual sense by our time of self-denial.
