Saint Paul indicated to us how the sacrament of baptism is the way by which we enter into the saving death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. Often times in the ancient churches there were baptismal fonts that had eight sides as a symbol of entering into the resurrection on the eighth day, that is the Sunday of the new week.
