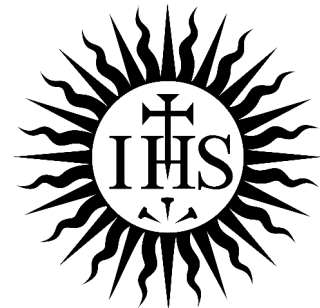

From the Book of Kings, we hear the experience of the prophet Elijah and his encounter with the Lord.
