Pastor's Piece

Dear Folks,

Most have probably heard of the seven deadly sins and that among them is the sin of anger. A thing that I always like to harp on is that it is the action of anger that is being spoken of here and not the feeling. When someone wrongs us, the emotion of anger will almost always snap right into us. The part that is sinful then is what we do with it. If we use it as an excuse to snap out, sin. If we stew upon it, sin. If we develop sensitivity so that even little things set us off, sin. But if we work on it with the grace that God provides we are actually able to develop and build the virtues of patience and long-suffering. May we trust in God to give ultimate justice as well as to carry us through the crosses we face in a given moment.
