Dear Folks,

In the parable our Lord gives of the three servants there is the obvious message that each of us is required to take the gifts that we have been given by God and make something of them. There is also a more subtle message that we must recognize that God gives to each one of us different gifts. We must not allow this to be a source for jealousy or envy but rather rejoice that each one of us has some unique glory of God to reflect. Even though our contribution might be smaller than someone else's it is absolutely unique and ours alone to make.
