

The Year of Saint Joseph

Pope Francis has declared a year in honor of Saint Joseph from Dec. 8, 2020 to Dec. 8, 2021. There are special plenary indulgences granted during this year, including the following:

- The plenary indulgence is also granted to the faithful who will recite the Litany to St. Joseph (for the Latin tradition), or the Akathistos to St. Joseph (for the Byzantine tradition), or any other prayer to St. Joseph proper to the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church ad intra and ad extra, and for the relief of all Christians suffering all forms of persecution. Because, the decree notes, "the flight of the Holy Family to Egypt shows us that God is there where man is in danger, where man suffers, where he runs away, where he experiences rejection and abandonment."

The Dogmas of the Catholic Church 5 of the 255 Infallibly Declared Dogmas

- 86) Not only as God but also as man Jesus Christ is the natural Son of God.
- 87) The God-Man Jesus Christ is to be venerated with one single mode of Worship, the absolute Worship of Latria which is due to God alone.
- 88) Christ's Divine and Human characteristics and activities are to be predicated of the one Word Incarnate.
- 89) Christ was free from all sin, from original sin as well as from all personal sin.
- 90) Christ's human nature was passible (capable of sensation & suffering).
