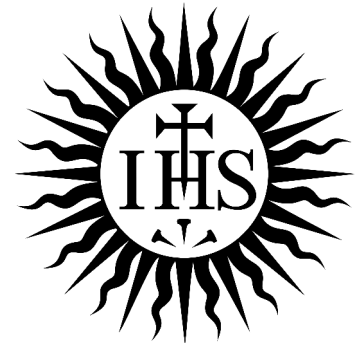

Dear Folks,

In the first reading Moses gives to the people of Israel the promise of a Messiah. Moses explains that this promise is made in answer to a prayer that the people made while he was up the mountain receiving the Ten Commandments. Within the context, the prayer was actually one of cowardice and showed a lack of faith. The Lord God shows His mercy in that even such a prayer is heard and is turned into a great blessing. Thus we should never fear to pray because we can't find just the right words or we might be afraid that we are praying for something wrong.
