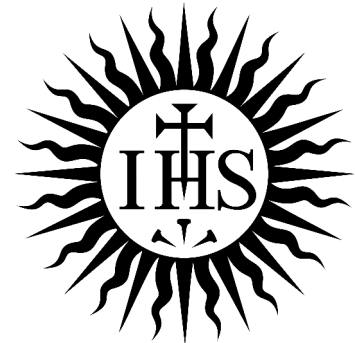

### The Dogmas of the Catholic Church *5 of the 255 Infallibly Declared Dogmas*

116) For the performance of a morally good action Sanctifying Grace is not required.

117) In the state of fallen nature it is morally impossible for man without Supernatural Revelation, to know easily, with absolute certainty and without admixture of error, all religious and moral truths of the natural order.

118) Grace cannot be merited by natural works either de condigno or de congruo.

119) God gives all the just sufficient grace (gratia proxime vel remote sufficiens) for the observation of the Divine Commandments.

120) God, by His Eternal Resolve of Will, has predetermined certain men to eternal blessedness.

## Pastor's Piece

**Dear Folks,**

From the Book of Genesis, we are presented with the sacrifice of Abraham of his son Isaac. In a part not included in this Sunday's reading Isaac asks Abraham where the lamb of sacrifice is. Abraham speaks in the Spirit saying that God Himself will provide the lamb. This is fulfilled when God the Father sends His Son to take upon Himself our humanity and to die for our sins. Isaac is a further type of our Lord in that he willingly underwent the preparations to be sacrificed. The fact that he carries the wood indicates that he was strong enough to have resisted his father but did not. May we willingly take the crosses that come our way and so imitate the example of Isaac and our Lord Jesus.
