The Dogmas of the Catholic Church 5 of the 255 Infallibly Declared Dogmas

- 121) God, by an Eternal Resolve of His Will, predestines certain men, on account of their foreseen sins, to eternal rejection.
- 122) The Human Will remains free under the influence of efficacious grace, which is not irresistible.
- 123) There is a grace which is truly sufficient and yet remains inefficacious (gratia vere et mere sufficiens).
- 124) The sinner can and must prepare himself by the help of actual grace for the reception of the grace by which he is justified.
- 125) The justification of an adult is not possible without Faith.

Dear Folks,

Our Lord Jesus often refers to Himself as the bridegroom and is doing so subtly in the Gospel passage for this Sunday. The false gods that the Samaritans worshipped were called baals, a word which meant husband. When Jesus declares to the woman that she has had five husbands perhaps He was speaking literally in terms of her marriages and divorces but He is ultimately speaking about her worship. Jesus as our God wants to be as intimate and as close to us as husband and wife. We are called to be joined to Him in such a way as to never be separated. May we say yes to our divine lover!
