

## Pastor's Piece

#### Dear Folks,

Unfortunately, I heard recently of someone attributing something to me that I did not say. The person who it got passed onto came and spoke to me and I am so very grateful for that. I was able to immediately dispel the false information. Please always remember this as the Gospel rule ... if we have a problem/concern with a person we must first make every reasonable effort to solve the problem with them one on one. The matter involved the COVID-19 vaccinations so I want to take this opportunity to restate what I said before and add some new information. To make things simple I will use the vocabulary used in the public press, even though some of the medicines involved aren't truly vaccines. Unfortunately, every vaccine currently being manufactured has been tainted in some way with the use of aborted baby cell lines. The Moderna and Pfizer vaccines were at least tested using the aborted baby cell lines and perhaps were used in the manufacturing of the original components. The AstraZeneca and Johnson & Johnson vaccines are actually made from the aborted baby cells directly. Given that the first two are less directly tainted to choose the latter two would be sinful. In terms of the cooperation with the evil of abortion and the notion of vaccines, the offices of the Pope on three occasions within the last two decades have said that if there are sufficiently grave reasons for taking a vaccine then it is permissible, that the cooperation would be remote enough to be permissible. It is up to the individual after consulting with their doctor, priest and doing their own research to decide how serious your situation is via the disease and whether or not the vaccine would be safe and effective for you. If you decide to take the vaccine you would be obliged to try to protest the fact that there are not untainted alternatives. The statements from the Pope's offices are not infallible, but they do have enough authority behind them that one can act in accord with the decision and avoid sin. On the other hand, since they are not infallible one may respectfully ask for clarification and question if other elements of the case need to be considered. Hopefully, this will help you in forming your conscience and making the right decision. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to email or call me.
