# Pastor's Piece

# Dear Folks,

A question that has come up within the last few decades of Church history is what is the current state of the Jewish people via their religion. Because of the holocaust committed by the Nazis in WW2 during which a horrifying number of nations and world leaders did nothing (see the SS St. Louis and the Struma), there was rightfully a lot of guilt that entered the world's conscience. Unfortunately, this often translated into the false idea that the Jews still could be saved as Jews. A clear example of this is the new Good Friday prayer in which their conversion to the Gospel is not specifically mentioned. The answer to this question is made clear by the passage we have this Sunday from Saint Paul. He basically says that he would be willing to go to hell if it meant that the Jews would be converted to Jesus Christ. Let us pray for our elder brethren that they might partake of the promises made to their ancestors and find salvation in Jesus Christ.
