Dear Folks,

We hopefully all are aware of the scene portrayed in our sanctuary when our Lord Jesus declared Simon to be Peter, the rock on which He would build His Church. Our Gospel passage for today though makes it clear that our Lord's decision was not something found only in a special, one-time event. St. John records for us that right from the beginning, the first time our Lord meets Simon, He is indicating He is going to change His name to Peter. We must then firmly resolve to cling always to that faith held by St. Peter.
