

The St Lucy Project, run by the Knights of Columbus of St Peter's, delivers food boxes to food pantries in Warren, Rappahannock, Page, Madison, Culpeper, and Fauquier counties. Each month, we make 2-5 deliveries, picking the food up from our depot at Loaves and Fishes in Front Royal. A delivery run normally takes two hours from start to finish.
