St Lucy Project

The St Lucy Project, run by the Knights of Columbus of St Peter's, delivers food boxes to food pantries in Warren, Rappahannock, Page, Madison, Culpeper, and Fauquier counties. In 2023, we delivered nearly 20,000 pounds of food to these pantries. We depend on volunteers to make these deliveries. Each month, we make 2-5 deliveries, picking the food up from our depot at Loaves and Fishes in Front Royal. A delivery run normally takes two hours from start to finish.
