

Our Lady's Easter Egg Hunt

At approximately 11:00 am on Easter Sunday (March 31), following the 9:45 am Easter Sunday Mass and prior to the beginning of the 11:30 am Mass, children are invited to participate in the annual Easter Egg Hunt in the field in front of St. Peter. The hunt is open to all children ages twelve and under. Children ages five and under may bring a helper. There will be 1,000 candy filled eggs. Twelve of the eggs will also contain one of Our Lady's Miraculous Medals. Only one egg will contain a Rosary. As per tradition, there will be a basket with candy filled eggs in the church vestibule for the children who attend the Easter Vigil and other morning Masses on Sunday.
