

Saint's Feast Day for St. Peter Parish: Monday, April 29, is the feast day of St. Catherine of Siena, one of the three patron saint's relics embedded in our altar. She was a 14th-century Italian mystic and is one of only four women who were named Doctor of the Church. She is best known for her efforts to bring about reform in the Catholic Church, for her writings, including her mystical The Dialogue, and for her charitable work caring for the sick and the poor.
