Pastor's Piece

Dear Folks,

When our Lord tells the crowd that they must eat His flesh and drink His blood they reply: "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Today the same is said of the passage from Saint Paul in the second reading. Sadly, even Pope Paul VI, who chose that name in honor of Saint Paul, found this teaching hard as he made it optional whether or not it is read at Mass that wives should be subordinate to their husbands. There are two important things to understanding this teaching. The phrase "as to the Lord" means that if the husband asks something against God's will it is to be ignored. The other thing is the way in which so many fail to look at the way in which the husband is to sacrifice and lay down his life for his wife. If the husband is doing his job of this self-sacrifice then no wife would hesitate to subordinate herself to that! May husbands and wives always be a living image of the love between Christ and His bride the Church!
