Thanksgiving Day Mass Schedule

Mass on Thanksgiving Day will be celebrated at 9:30 am, Thursday, November 28th. There will not be an evening 7 pm Mass or Holy Hour that day.

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception

Since the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception(December 8) falls on the Second Sunday of Advent in 2024, the observance of the Solemnity is transferred to Monday December 9. The faithful are still required to attend Holy Mass on December 9.

Masses which take place in the evening of Saturday December 7 and on Sunday December 8 are to be for the Second Sunday of Advent, including Masses which are offered on Sunday evening (there is no Vigil Mass for the Immaculate Conception this year). On Monday December 9, all Masses would be offered for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

The faithful may fulfill their obligation to attend Mass for the Sunday and for the Holy Day by attending Mass on Sunday, **and** by attending Mass on Monday December 9. It is obligatory for the faithful to attend Mass for both days. One Mass does not fulfill the obligation for both days.

Rosary Rally
