Moving Forward on our Parish Library: We are moving forward with our plans to create a library at St. Peter's, which will be filled with informative and inspirational resources to help us grow in our Catholic faith. We are committed to making this vision a reality.

Ministry of Mercy Meetings – Monday, August 4 and 18: The next meetings for the Ministry of Mercy will take place on Monday, August 4 following the rosary for parish needs. The focus will be the parish library and our plans for the Fall.

Adoration is held every Friday between the 8:30 AM and 11:15 AM Masses. It begins with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in a monstrance on the altar, accompanied by song, incense, and prayers. Following this, there is a quiet period for adoration, meditation, and prayer in the presence of Jesus. Confession is also offered at this time. The time of Adoration concludes before the 11:15 AM Mass with song, prayer, and a blessing for the congregation. The priest uses the monstrance to make the sign of the cross over the people.

A Holy Hour is held every Thursday evening after the 7:00 PM Mass. This is a time we set aside for prayer with Jesus present in our tabernacle. It may include the evening Liturgy of the Hours, silent prayer, meditations, novena prayers, and more. There is also an opportunity to go to Confession at this time.
